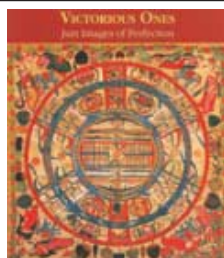

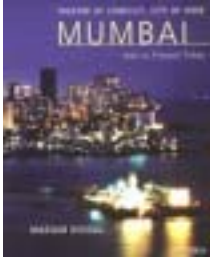


Painted Images of Enlightenment: Early Tibetan Thankas, 1050-1450

Ever since the publication of Giuseppe Tucci’s monumental book on thankas in 1949, early Tibetan thankas have fascinated scholars. In 1984, when Pratapaditya Pal wrote his ground breaking book “Tibetan Painting”, probably fewer than 50 of these 11th-14th century Tibetan paintings on cloth were known. Since then over 300 early thankas have appeared. These works provide a plethora of new data for the art historian, and their study had transformed our understanding of their iconography and chronology. They have also transformed our knowledge of early Tibetan history and monasticism.

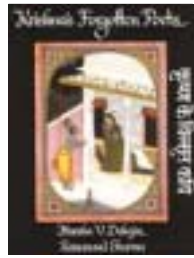

Umaraukoshā (1807 AD) by Suvamsha Shukla of Biswan, district Sitapur, is based on the famous Sanskrit work **Amarakoshā** (4th cent.), which was confined to define the gender of terms in Sanskrit. It goes to the superb intellectual dexterity and genius of Suvamsha, to improve upon the original source. More than a hundred Sanskrit terms, like 'vishikha' (arrow), 'ashana' (eating) and 'ambaka' (eye), which are missing in **Amarakoshā**, can be found in **Umaraukoshā**. This lexicographer has also included scores of terms of Persian and Arabic origin in common parlance, such as kaharuva (camphor), bakhtara (armour), khaktuuda (a butt), sum (hoof); whereas qasid, (postman) is from Arabic. They are juxtaposed to Sanskrit synonyms.

Besides, **Umaraukoshā** is a virtual treasure trove of scores of words from early Khariboli Hindi, like 'galaphar' and 'bhangaradika,' which are now obsolete. There were many words, which could not go beyond Pali and Apabhramsha stages – an interesting example picked up by Suvamsha is 'kanaila' (oleander).

Umaraukoshā is an all round dictionary. It is a treasury of Sanskrit, middle Brajabhāsha, and modern Khariboli terms: more than 11,000 of which are indexed at the end.

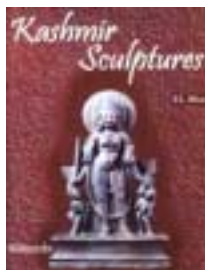
