eLibrary Overview: The World Bank eLibrary is the World Bank’s subscription-based full-text collection of more than 6,000 books, reports, journals and other documents on social and economic development. It is fully searchable by subject, region, keyword, title, author, abstract, or year of publication. It also includes complete metadata and MARC records, TOC alerts and RSS feeds, and COUNTER compliant usage statistics.

Key Selling Points/Value Proposition:

- It provides useful tools and conveniences for librarians, students, professors, government agencies, and development professionals that use World Bank knowledge and research.
